Earle R. Wilcox Memorial Awards honor individuals who have made significant contributions in the field of Indian forestry or natural resources. These awards are given in honor of Mr. Earle R. Wilcox, who will always be remembered for his significant achievements on behalf of Indian people and their forests. Awards will be presented June 7, 2018, during the Awards Banquet at the Forty-Second Annual National Indian Timber Symposium in Ocean Shores, WA.

Nominations can be made by anyone, not just supervisors or upper level management. Tribal leaders and Tribal Councils are encouraged to make nominations. Follow the procedures outlined in the enclosed award packet, or online at http://www.itcnet.org/about\_us/awards.html. Make sure your nominations, with supporting documentation, are in our office by the close of business (5:00 p.m. Pacific Standard Time) January 31, 2018.

Nominations must be received by the Intertribal Timber Council office by the close of business (5:00 p.m. Pacific Standard Time) January 31, 2018. Incomplete applications received after that date will not be considered.

# EARLE R. WILCOX MEMORIAL NATIONAL AND INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

### **GENERAL RULES**

(Established 12/19/86)

- 1. An individual may receive only one EARLE WILCOX MEMORIAL NATIONAL AWARD during his or her lifetime.
- 2. If an individual received an *Individual* achievement award, there is a waiting period of five (5) years before the same individual can be nominated for, and receive, a second achievement award.
- 3. An individual may be nominated for an Individual Award, a National Award, or both.
- 4. Nominators will be notified of the committee's decision.

### **SELECTING AN INDIVIDUAL:**

Award recipients will be selected by the Intertribal Timber Council Awards Committee based on the criteria listed at the end of the Nomination form (page 4). Generally, nominees should have:

- 1. Made significant professional contributions.
- 2. Motivated or inspired others to perform and exceed in the performance of their duties.
- 3. Demonstrated outstanding competence, innovation, or creativity.
- 4. Been instrumental in influencing natural resources management.

### **NATIONAL AWARD:**

There will be one nationwide award, the "EARLE WILCOX OUTSTANDING FORESTER OF THE YEAR" award. This award shall be presented to an individual who has made a significant nationwide contribution to the Indian Forestry Program. The award is a mounted, silver-plated, cruiser axe with engraved plaque.

### **INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS:**

Achievement awards shall be presented to individuals who have made outstanding contributions or special achievements to the Indian natural resources program. Awards are engraved plaques and are distributed by geographic areas as follows:

# EARLE WILCOX MEMORIAL NATIONAL AND INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

### **AWARD CRITERIA**

The following criteria establish how the EARLE WILCOX MEMORIAL AWARD applications will be evaluated.

### CATEGORY 1: TRIBAL INVOLVEMENT

Weight Factor 2.0 (10 points maximum)

Involvement with Tribes and their membership is the foundation upon which successful programs or projects are successful over the long-term. Recognition by individuals of this factor and its utilization are the key to long-term success. Tribal involvement can take many forms. Be careful to recognize them all.

### CATEGORY 2: IMPROVEMENT OF INDIAN RESOURCES OR PROGRAMS

Weight Factor 2.5 (10 points maximum)

Normally this factor is self-evident. Many times individuals who have contributed in this category have received little personal publicity. Be sure to look at the factors being judged as well as the individual.

### CATEGORY 3: INDIVIDUAL EFFORT

Weight Factor 2.0 (10 points maximum)

Describe the effort the individual has expended to improve management of Indian resources. Caution: in some cases, an individual can be in the right place at the right time and receive the credit for something other individuals have created.

### CATEGORY 4: CAN BE USED AS MODEL

Weight Factor 0.8 (10 points maximum)

Whenever possible, the ability to duplicate the concept on other Indian resources is desirable, but not necessary. The adaptability of a concept to "on the ground" is of value.

### CATEGORY 5: TECHNICAL ACHIEVEMENT AND APPLICATION

Weight Factor 2.0 (10 points maximum)

Wherever possible we wish to encourage and reward professional developments and their practical application in the field. We will weigh the practical application as greatly as the technical development. It is our desire to recognize individuals who can get it done "back home."

### CATEGORY 6: OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES OR FUNDS

Weight Factor 0.8 (10 points maximum)

Describe ways the individual has creatively secured new or underutilized funding sources to support resource management on Indian lands.

### CATEGORY 7: ORIGINALITY

Weight Factor 0.9 (10 points maximum)

New ideas are important to the development of Indian lands and can reflect on individual dedication and initiative.

### CATEGORY 8: REFERENCES

Weight Factor 2.0 (10 points maximum)

Submit, with this application, a minimum of two letters of reference, on letterhead and signed, addressing the personal and professional contributions of the nominee.
