

Tribal and Public Lands Stewardship Intern

The National Wildlife Federation (NWF) is seeking an intern to assist in advancing the protection of wildlife, their habitats, and natural resources on tribal and public lands. NWF's Tribal Lands Conservation Program partners with sovereign tribal nations to solve today's conservation challenges for future generations.

Responsibilities will include assisting with climate change projects, conventional energy projects, environmental education, research, writing, grant development, monitoring federal policy, helping to organize meetings and events, and other associated tasks relative to NWF's public and tribal lands programs. The intern will be exposed to many aspects of natural resource policy and management pertaining to tribal and public lands, tribal trust resources, and tribal natural resources.

A motivated individual is sought for a full-time, 11-month, paid internship in NWF's office located in Boulder, Colorado. The Tribal Lands Stewardship Intern must be available to work a 40-hour weekly schedule. The position offers \$400/week plus core benefits.

Qualifications: 2 years of B.A./B.S. completed or Associates Degree. Candidates should have excellent analytic and written communication skills, experience with computer and library research, and computer skills. Candidates must have a commitment to natural resource conservation and assisting tribal communities.
