Communicate with individual members, tribes, stakeholders and the public at large about issues affecting natural resource management. Communication among member tribes, partners, and the public are timely, relevant, accessible, and comprehensive.	1. Improve dissemination of information accessible through ITC media platforms.

<b>Goal 3: Organizational Stability</b>	<b>Objectives: Organizational Stability</b>
To have an organization which is financially sound, structurally stable and compliant.	1. Maintain and expand funding sources.

	3. Preserve and strengthen participation and engagement of member tribes in the function, governance and activities of the organization.

<b>Goal 4: Natural Resource Management Policy &amp; Practices</b>	<b>Objectives: Policy</b>
ITC and member tribes strive to have significant influence over management of Indian lands and traditional areas.	1. Increase awareness among policy makers about the advantages of tribal forest management.
	2. Advocate for meeting the trust responsibility for Indian forests.
	3. Address tribal concerns and interests in traditional territories.
	4. Advocate for tribal priorities for fire prevention, suppression, and rehabilitation.
	5. Advocate for policies that respect and support tribal sovereignty.
	6. Utilize IFMAT's findings and recommendations to support and improve the management of Indian resources.
	<b>Objectives: Forest &amp; Fire Management</b>
	7. Provide a forum and resources to share technical tools to improve resource management.
	8. ITC will provide leadership in addressing emerging forest and fire issues.
	9. Collaborate with BIA and other land management agencies interested in improving the management of Indian natural resources.
	10. Provide a forum for tribal research needs, and an opportunity to collaborate with universities and agencies.
